


Limerick Forest

Discover Our Vast Trail System

Forest trails are located in Augusta and Edwardsburgh-Cardinal Townships, North Grenville and Merrickville-Wolford.

Limerick South, located south of Bishops Mills in North Grenville, was settled in the late 1840s by Irish immigrants and was named after a former homestead in Ireland. By the 1910s settlers had a hard time farming the dry, sandy soil for agriculture, and when the Great Depression hit in the 1930s, the land was abandoned.

Today, the Limerick Forest consists of 5,782 hectares of community forest. Within the forest is 180 km of trails ranging from single track to access roads. The trail system is also accessible throughout the winter months. There are 30kms of groomed snowmobile trails maintained by the Leeds & Grenville Snowmobile Association.

There are a number of information kiosks installed throughout Limerick Forest which provides public service announcements, 911 locations and trail maps.

Visitors to Limerick forest are encouraged to enjoy their time in the forest. Activities like mountain biking, cross country skiing, geo-caching and bird watching are welcomed. However, some activities are restricted in order to ensure the wellbeing of the forest. Overnight camping and campfires are not permitted. Permanent tree stands and the cutting or removal of trees are also prohibited. Motorized vehicles are welcome on all trails in Limerick except for those north of the Limerick Interpretive Centre on the "Chalet Loop".
