They're the scariest rides around when ghosts and goblins, witches and phantoms take over the farm every Friday and Saturday night in October. These rides leave from 7:00pm to 10:00pm. All funds raised go towards the Spencerville Agricultural Society. Refreshments are available and parking is free.


